

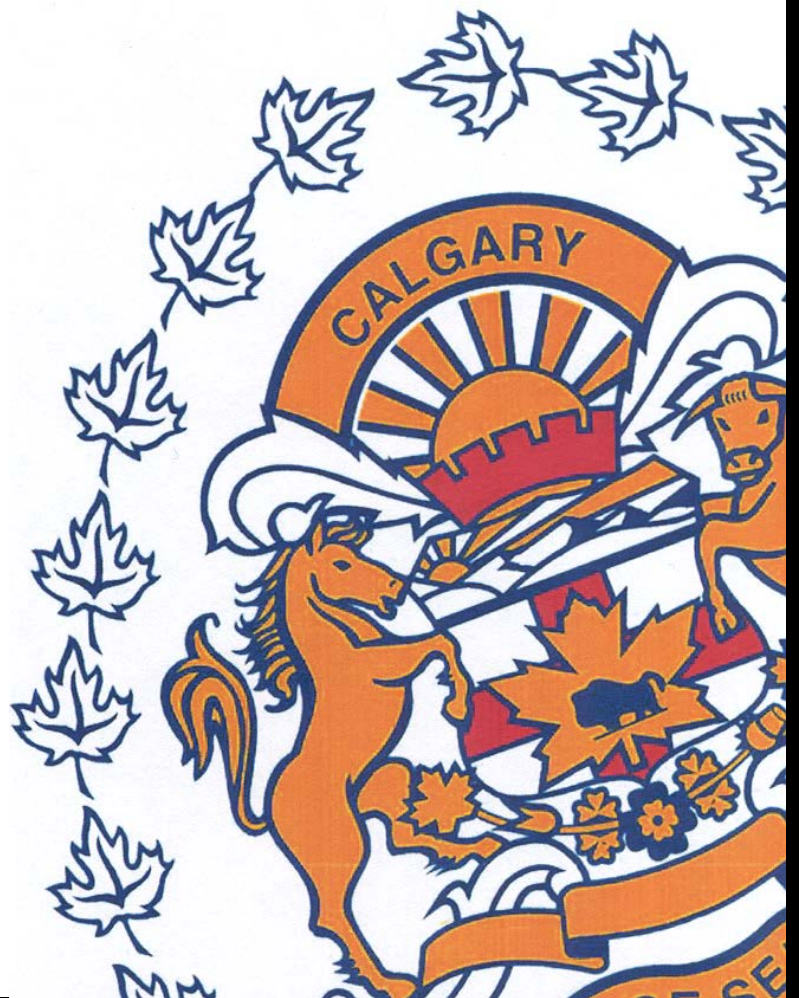

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## REPORT NOTES

Most of the statistical data in this report are derived from the Police Information Management System (PIMS) and compiled by the Centralized Analysis Section. The numbers reported may change on a daily basis due to the dynamic nature of offences being reported and cleared. Disorder data is derived from the CAD system and is static.

To a large extent, the data in this report are based on accumulated to date information. **(Except for the Monthly Highlights which are based on static information (i.e.: a snap-shot in time).**

- For offences based on accumulated to date information, the number of offences recorded may be higher than previously reported (i.e. in previous statistical reports) due to late reporting. Although this does not greatly affect the number of occurrences for all offences, for some categories it may be as high as a 30-40% increase. The published data for the current period can therefore be expected to increase as time passes. As a result, readers should exercise caution when making comparisons between historical data and current data (i.e. previous year to this year) as data for the historic period will now include late reported offences, but data for the current period will not at this time. To achieve an effective comparison, current data should be evaluated against the originally published data for the historic period.
- Likewise, late reporting affects the number and percentage of offences cleared. Cases are often cleared months and sometimes years later. Consequently, clearances for previous years may appear to be much higher than those of the present year. Cases "cleared by charge" and those "cleared otherwise" are included in these totals.
- For offences based on "static" or "snap-shot" information, data totals will only reflect the number of offences reported in the original publication. They are not updated. Although late reporting may occur, and offences may continue to be cleared as time passes, these new events are not taken into account when preparing this statistical report.

A single incident may result in multiple offences, with each unique *Criminal Code* violation within the incident being counted as an offence. Furthermore, person crime offences are typically counted by the number of victims. Please note that offences are assigned to the month in which the offence "started", not the month they were reported or cleared. Also note that "attempted" incidents are included in these totals. For a more detailed explanation of the Offence counting procedure, please contact the Centralized Analysis Section.

In July 2006 the electronic reporting process with respect to 24-hour suspensions changed. This is reflected by a large decrease in Provincial Statute offences.

## Monthly Highlights – STATIC NUMBER COMPARISON

To reduce the impact of late reporting, comments on this page are a comparison between the CPS July 2011 Statistical Report and the CPS July 2010 Statistical Report (see next page "Calgary Crime Statistics – STATIC NUMBERS"). To achieve an effective comparison, current data should be evaluated against the originally published data for the historic period.

### JULY 2011

#### PERSON CRIME

- ◆ Reported **person crimes** for the month of July 2011 decreased 18.2% when compared to July 2010 (652 offences in July 2011 vs. 797 in July 2010); year-to-date numbers show a decrease of 8.3% (4685 offences YTD 2011 vs. 5111 YTD 2010).
- ◆ Total **robbery** offences for the month of July 2011 decreased 40.8% when compared to July 2010 (61 offences in July 2011 vs. 103 in July 2010); year-to-date offences decreased 13.8% when compared to YTD 2010 (594 offences in July 2011 vs. 689 in July 2010).
  - There were 14 **commercial robberies** this month (compared to 24 in July 2010); and
  - There were 40 **person robberies** this month (compared to 68 in July 2010).
- ◆ **Assaults** decreased 14.2% this month (489 offences in July 2011 vs. 570 in July 2010); year-to-date figures decreased 5.7 % (3398 offences YTD 2011 vs. 3602 YTD 2010).
- ◆ **Sex** offences decreased 4.2% this month (68 offences in July 2011 vs. 71 in July 2010). YTD figures reflect a 12.9% decrease (412 offences YTD 2011 vs. 473 YTD 2010).

#### PROPERTY CRIME

- ◆ Reported **property crimes** this month decreased 16.1% when compared to July 2010 (3384 offences in July 2011 compared to 4035 in July 2010); year-to-date figures decreased 7.4% (22731 offences YTD 2011 vs. 24541 YTD 2010).
- ◆ **Vehicle theft** (including attempts) decreased 25.4% this month when compared to July 2010 (334 offences in July 2011 vs. 448 in July 2010); year-to-date figures reflect a decrease of 4.9% (2442 offences YTD 2011 vs. 2567 YTD 2010).
- ◆ **Theft** offences decreased 9.8% this month when compared to July 2010 (1755 offences in July 2011 vs. 1946 in July 2010); year-to-date offences decreased 4.9% (11097 offences YTD 2011 vs. 11671 YTD 2010).
- ◆ **Break and enter** offences this month decreased 26.2% when compared to July 2010 (479 offences this month compared to 649 in July 2010); year-to-date offences decreased 22.3% (2984 offences YTD 2011 vs. 3840 YTD 2010).
  - **Residential break and enter** offences this month decreased 14.5% when compared to July 2010 (241 offences in July 2011 vs. 282 in July 2010); year-to-date figures show a 13.0% decrease (1355 offences in July 2011 vs. 1557 in July 2010).
  - **Commercial break and enter** offences decreased 46.6% this month when compared to July 2010 (159 offences in July 2011 vs. 298 in July 2010); year-to-date offences decreased 34.2% (1196 offences YTD 2011 vs. 1818 YTD 2010).
- ◆ **Fraud related** offences decreased 13.2% this month (131 offences in July 2011 vs. 151 in July 2010); year-to-date offences increased 4.0% (1446 offences YTD 2011 vs. 1391 YTD 2010).

#### DISORDER

- ◆ Reported **disorder incidents** this month decreased 7.5% when compared to July 2010 (10435 incidents in July 2011 compared to 11277 in July 2010); year-to-date figures reflect a 6.3% decrease (56810 incidents YTD 2011 vs. 60649 YTD 2010).
- ◆ Physical disorder incidents decreased by 18.9% this month. Both **property damage** and **abandoned auto** recorded decreases in July, while there was a notable increase of **fire** incidents.
- ◆ Social disorder incidents decreased by 6.1% this month. Following a similar trend as seen in May and June, **suspicious person** incidents recorded the most notable decrease with 516 fewer incidents than July 2010. **Noise complaint** incidents decreased this month as well (679 incidents in July 2011 vs. 786 in July 2010). The only event type to record a notable increase was **intoxicated persons** (1166 incidents in July 2011 compared to 1015 in July 2010), although volumes seen this month are similar to those seen in July 2009 (1158 incidents).

## Calgary Crime Statistics – STATIC NUMBERS

The static crime numbers on this page are derived from historical Calgary Police Service Monthly Statistical Reports. These statistics are used when writing the Monthly Highlights page in order to make a fair comparison using data which has not been allowed to increase due to late reporting of crime. Using static numbers allows us to compare crime levels at a specific point in time and make an accurate determination of increases or decreases.

The cumulative crime numbers (pages 8 – 11) are statistics derived from the CPS Police Information Management System. P.I.M.S. cannot produce static numbers and therefore the cumulative numbers reflect any late reporting of crime. To achieve an effective comparison, current data should be evaluated against the originally published data for the historic period.

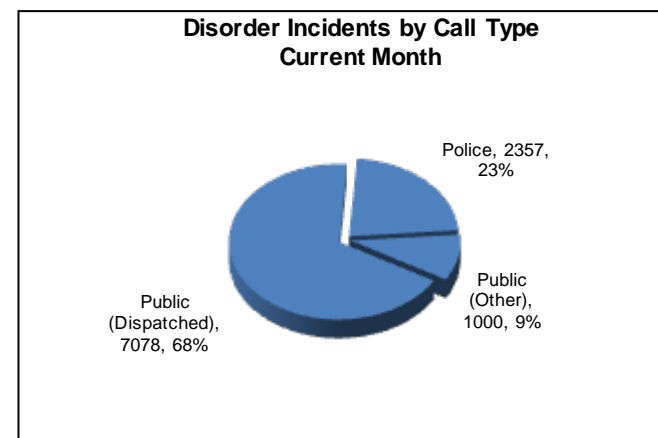
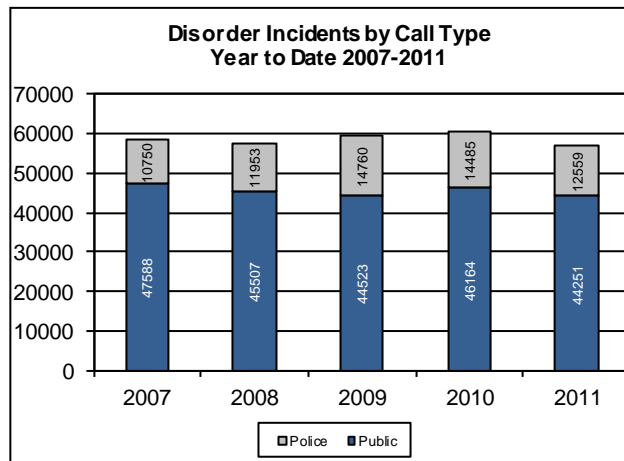

# Calgary Disorder Statistics – CALLS FOR SERVICE

In addition to monitoring crime levels, the Calgary Police Service uses a range of incident types to record levels of "Social Disorder". The incident types selected for this disorder index are those which can have a negative impact on citizens' quality of life and perception of safety, particularly in public places. These incidents do not tend to be represented well in "traditional" crime statistics which have a propensity to focus more on person and property crime.

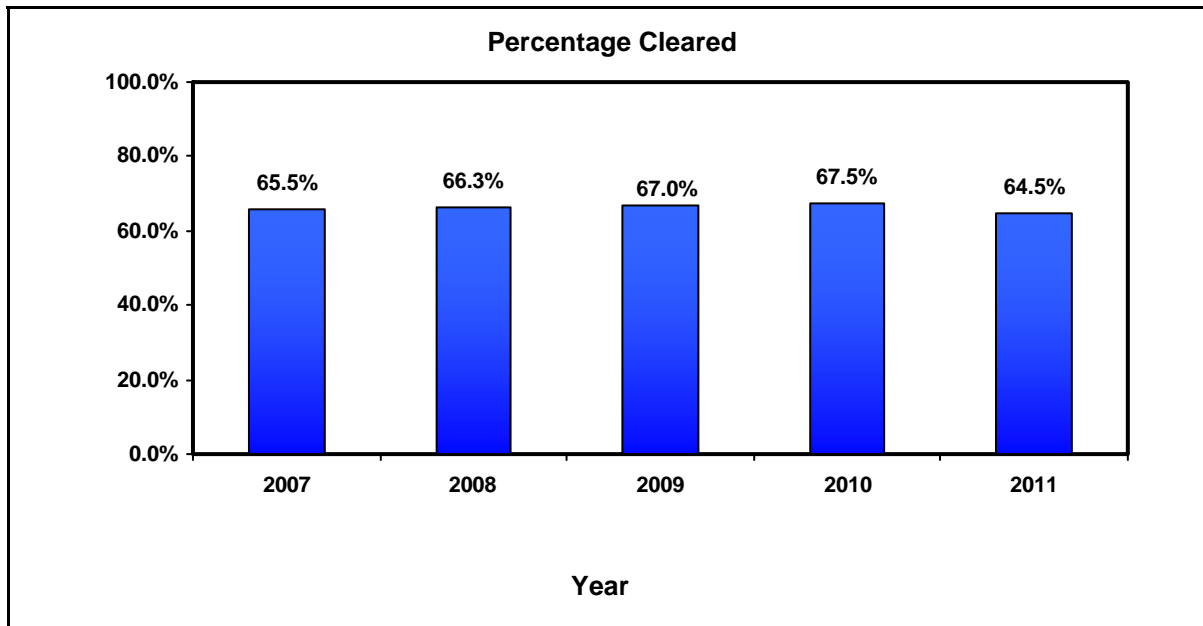
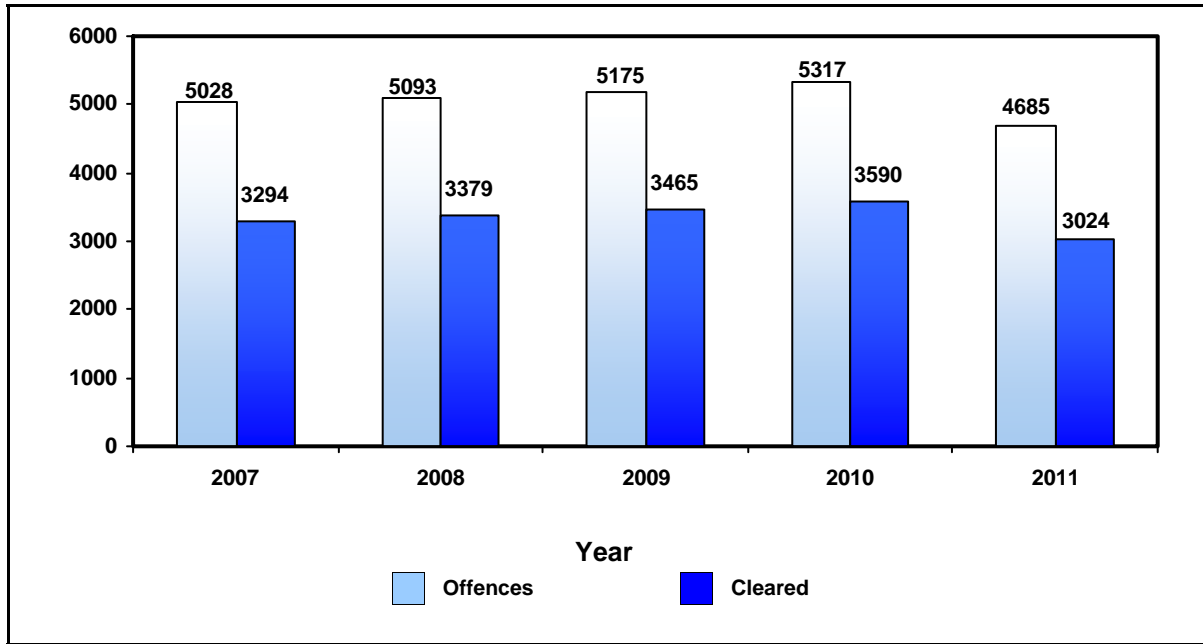

Physical disorder-abandoned auto, fire and property damage.

  - 2) Call Type: "Police" refers to onview calls; "Public" refers to dispatched, advised, walk-in, call back calls and web reports.

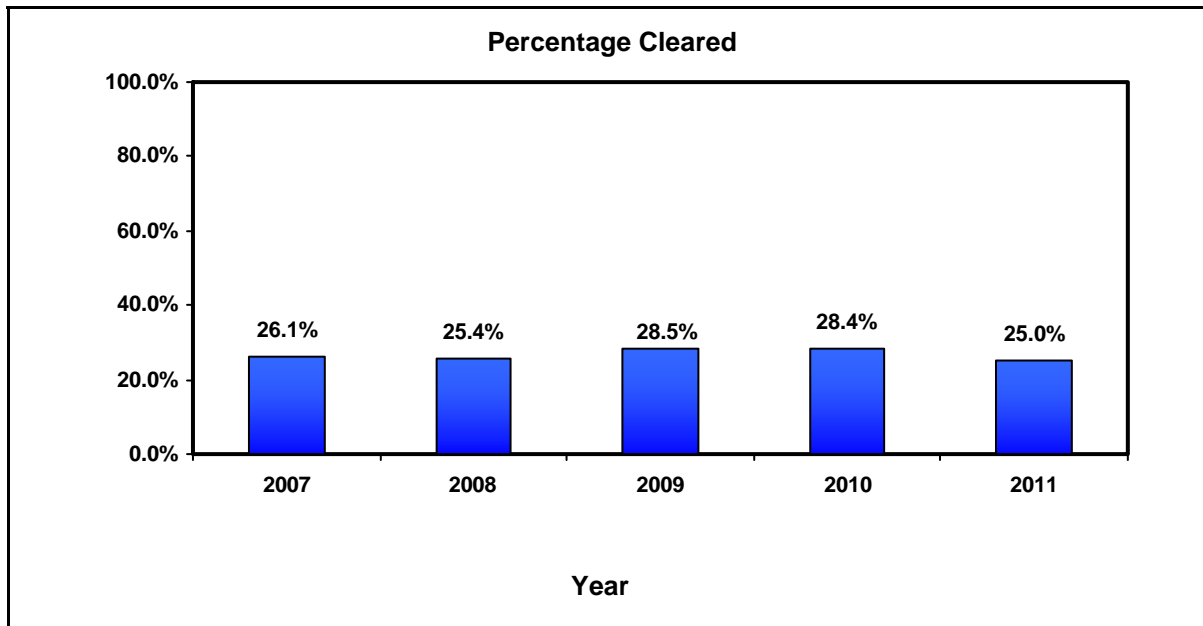
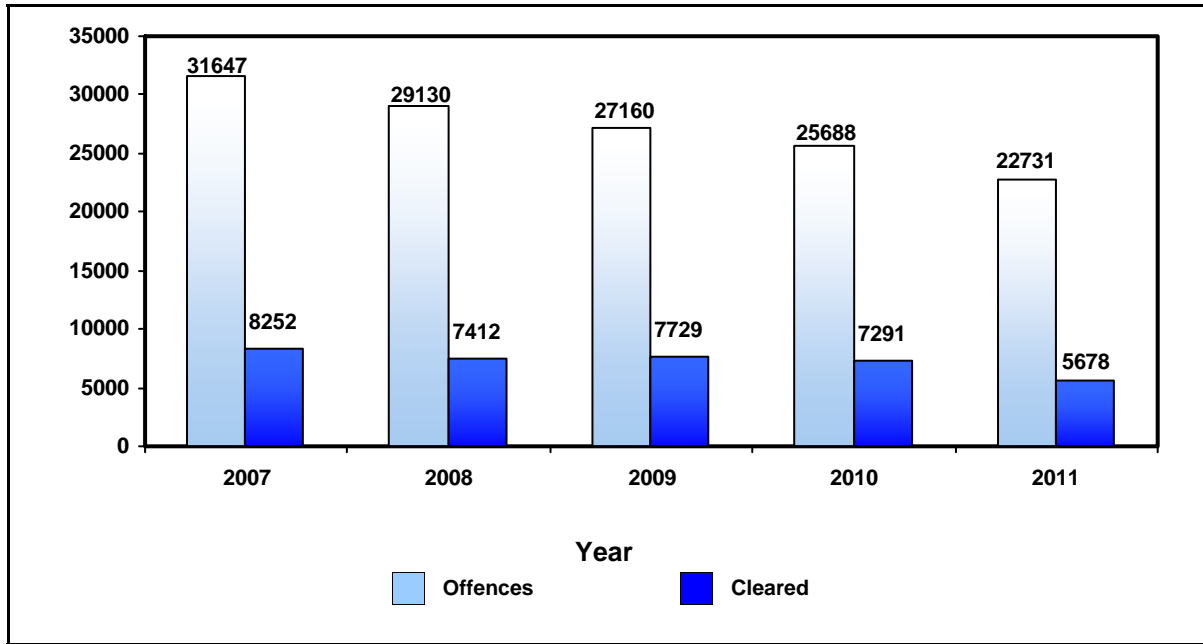
Number of Offences Year to Date



# Property Crimes - CUMULATIVE NUMBERS

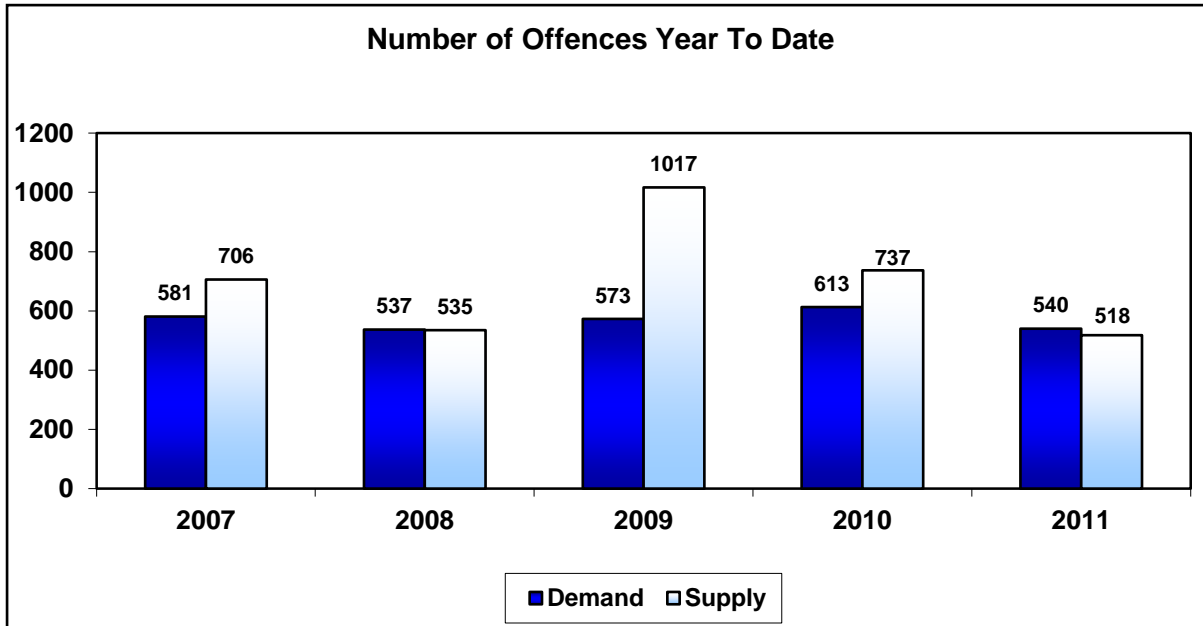

### Number of Offences Year to Date

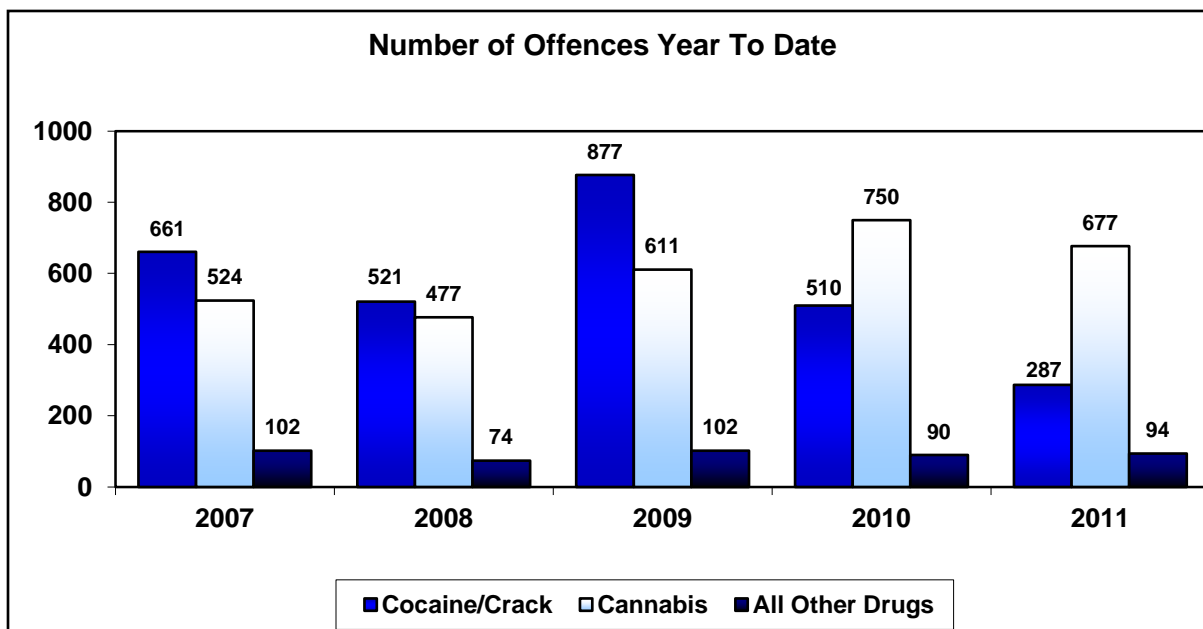


# Drug Offences – CUMULATIVE NUMBERS

When interpreting this data, it is imperative to consider that these figures represent only the number of collisions and they do not account for associated traffic volumes, weather conditions, types of collisions, driver experience, or any other variables which may or may not be significant factors. The locations denoted might be associated with intersections, on/off ramps, or mid-block locations, which are close but not necessarily at the exact specified locations. Collisions occurring on private properties, such as shopping mall parking lots have been excluded from the data in order to strictly assess intersection related collisions.
