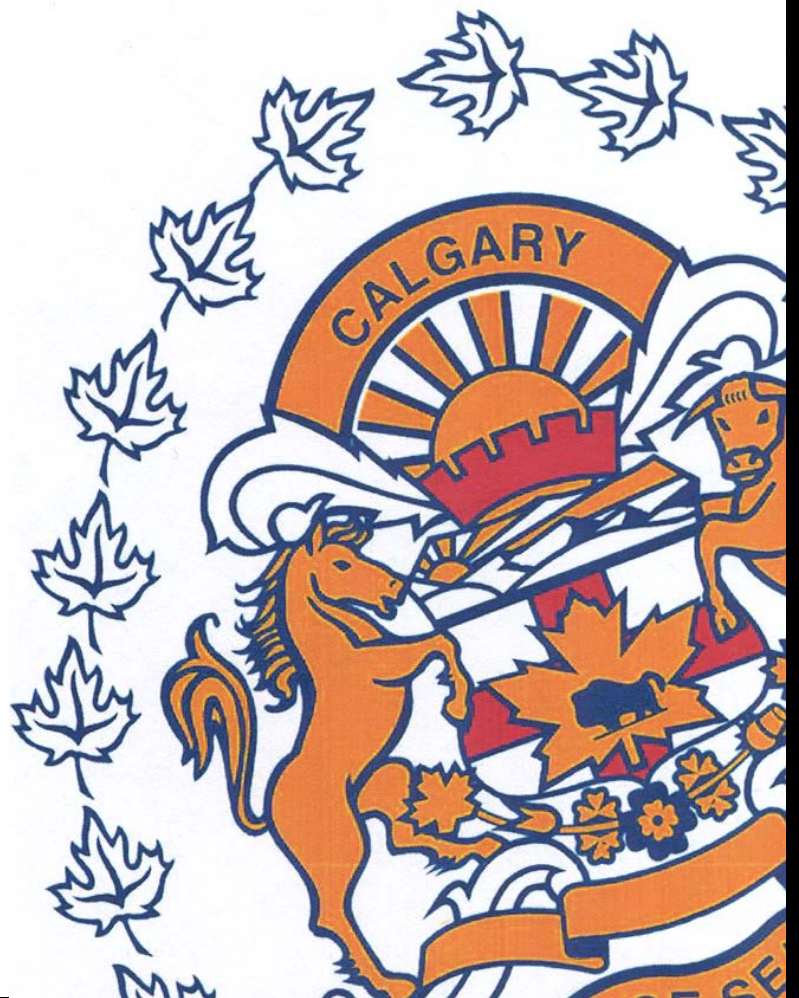


# September Monthly Statistical REPORT 2011

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## REPORT NOTES

Most of the statistical data in this report are derived from the Police Information Management System (PIMS) and compiled by the Centralized Analysis Section. The numbers reported may change on a daily basis due to the dynamic nature of offences being reported and cleared. Disorder data is derived from the CAD system and is static.

To a large extent, the data in this report are based on accumulated to date information. **(Except for the Monthly Highlights which are based on static information (i.e.: a snap-shot in time).**

- For offences based on accumulated to date information, the number of offences recorded may be higher than previously reported (i.e. in previous statistical reports) due to late reporting. Although this does not greatly affect the number of occurrences for all offences, for some categories it may be as high as a 30-40% increase. The published data for the current period can therefore be expected to increase as time passes. As a result, readers should exercise caution when making comparisons between historical data and current data (i.e. previous year to this year) as data for the historic period will now include late reported offences, but data for the current period will not at this time. To achieve an effective comparison, current data should be evaluated against the originally published data for the historic period.
- Likewise, late reporting affects the number and percentage of offences cleared. Cases are often cleared months and sometimes years later. Consequently, clearances for previous years may appear to be much higher than those of the present year. Cases "cleared by charge" and those "cleared otherwise" are included in these totals.
- For offences based on "static" or "snap-shot" information, data totals will only reflect the number of offences reported in the original publication. They are not updated. Although late reporting may occur, and offences may continue to be cleared as time passes, these new events are not taken into account when preparing this statistical report.

A single incident may result in multiple offences, with each unique *Criminal Code* violation within the incident being counted as an offence. Furthermore, person crime offences are typically counted by the number of victims. Please note that offences are assigned to the month in which the offence "started", not the month they were reported or cleared. Also note that "attempted" incidents are included in these totals. For a more detailed explanation of the Offence counting procedure, please contact the Centralized Analysis Section.

In July 2006 the electronic reporting process with respect to 24-hour suspensions changed. This is reflected by a large decrease in Provincial Statute offences.

## Monthly Highlights – STATIC NUMBER COMPARISON

To reduce the impact of late reporting, comments on this page are a comparison between the CPS September 2011 Statistical Report and the CPS September 2010 Statistical Report (see next page "Calgary Crime Statistics – STATIC NUMBERS"). To achieve an effective comparison, current data should be evaluated against the originally published data for the historic period.

### SEPTEMBER 2011

#### PERSON CRIME

- ◆ Reported **person crimes** for the month of September 2011 decreased 8.1% when compared to September 2010 (628 offences in September 2011 vs. 683 in September 2010); year-to-date numbers show a decrease of 9.3% (5962 offences YTD 2011 vs. 6576 YTD 2010).
- ◆ Total **robbery** offences in September 2011 decreased 27.5% when compared to September 2010 (79 offences in September 2011 vs. 109 in September 2010); year-to-date offences decreased 17.4% when compared to YTD 2010 (750 offences in September 2011 vs. 908 in September 2010).
  - There were 15 **commercial robberies** this month (compared to 31 in September 2010).
- ◆ **Assaults** decreased 7.0% this month (455 offences in September 2011 vs. 489 in September 2010); year-to-date figures decreased 6.5% (4290 offences YTD 2011 vs. 4587 YTD 2010).

#### PROPERTY CRIME

- ◆ Reported **property crimes** this month decreased 2.8% when compared to September 2010 (3328 offences in September 2011 compared to 3425 in September 2010); year-to-date figures decreased 6.0% (30602 offences YTD 2011 vs. 32543 YTD 2010).
- ◆ **Vehicle theft** (including attempts) decreased 29.8% this month when compared to September 2010 (314 offences in September 2011 vs. 447 in September 2010); year-to-date figures reflect a decrease of 8.8% (3163 offences YTD 2011 vs. 3469 YTD 2010).
- ◆ **Theft** offences increased 3.4% this month when compared to September 2010 (1695 offences in September 2011 vs. 1640 in September 2010); year-to-date offences decreased 3.0% (14995 offences YTD 2011 vs. 15456 YTD 2010).
- ◆ **Break and enter** offences this month decreased 15.3% when compared to September 2010 (493 offences this month compared to 582 in September 2010); year-to-date offences decreased 18.7% (4165 offences YTD 2011 vs. 5125 YTD 2010).
  - **Residential break and enter** offences this month decreased 17.9% when compared to September 2010 (211 offences in September 2011 vs. 257 in September 2010); year-to-date figures show a 9.9% decrease (1897 offences in September 2011 vs. 2106 in September 2010).
  - **Commercial break and enter** offences decreased 30.3% this month when compared to September 2010 (175 offences in September 2011 vs. 251 in September 2010); year-to-date offences decreased 31.0% (1630 offences YTD 2011 vs. 2361 YTD 2010).
- ◆ **Fraud related** offences increased 57.1% this month (165 offences in September 2011 vs. 105 in September 2010); year-to-date offences increased 2.7%.

#### DISORDER

- ◆ Reported **disorder incidents** this month increased 6.3% when compared to September 2010 (9307 incidents in September 2011 compared to 8752 in September 2010); year-to-date figures reflect a 4.4% decrease (76204 incidents YTD 2011 vs. 79717 YTD 2010).
- ◆ Physical disorder incidents decreased 1.5% this month. Similar to the trend seen in July and August, **fire** was the only physical disorder event type to record an increase.
- ◆ September was the first month in 2011 to record an increase of social disorder incidents (+7.3% compared to September 2010). **Disturbance** and **intoxicated person** incidents both drove this increase (~30% above levels recorded in September 2010). **Unwanted guests** (+83 incidents) and **party complaints** (+67 incidents) also recorded increases when compared to September 2010. **Suspicious person** was the only event type to document a notable decrease (2228 incidents in September 2011 vs. 2474 in September 2010). Year-to-date social disorder figures demonstrate a 3.9% decrease (67987 offences YTD 2011 vs. 70716 YTD 2011).

## Calgary Crime Statistics – STATIC NUMBERS

The static crime numbers on this page are derived from historical Calgary Police Service Monthly Statistical Reports. These statistics are used when writing the Monthly Highlights page in order to make a fair comparison using data which has not been allowed to increase due to late reporting of crime. Using static numbers allows us to compare crime levels at a specific point in time and make an accurate determination of increases or decreases.

The cumulative crime numbers (pages 8 – 11) are statistics derived from the CPS Police Information Management System. P.I.M.S. cannot produce static numbers and therefore the cumulative numbers reflect any late reporting of crime. To achieve an effective comparison, current data should be evaluated against the originally published data for the historic period.

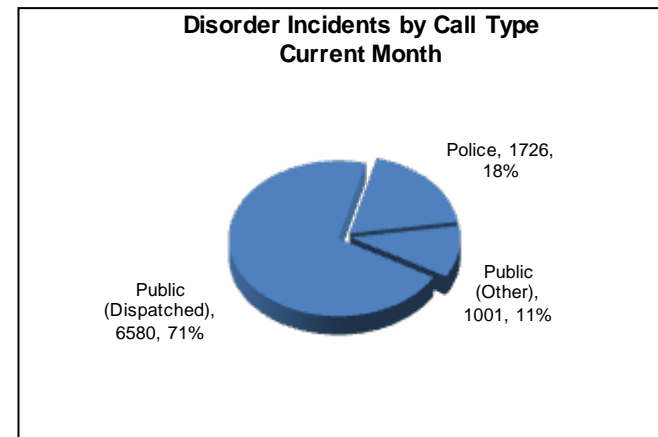
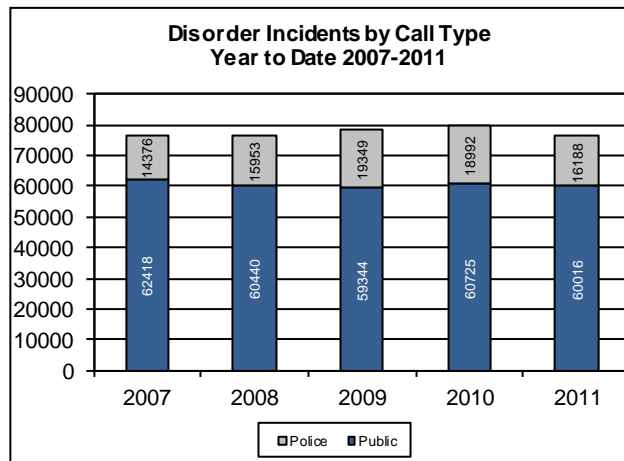

# Calgary Disorder Statistics – CALLS FOR SERVICE

In addition to monitoring crime levels, the Calgary Police Service uses a range of incident types to record levels of "Social Disorder". The incident types selected for this disorder index are those which can have a negative impact on citizens' quality of life and perception of safety, particularly in public places. These incidents do not tend to be represented well in "traditional" crime statistics which have a propensity to focus more on person and property crime.

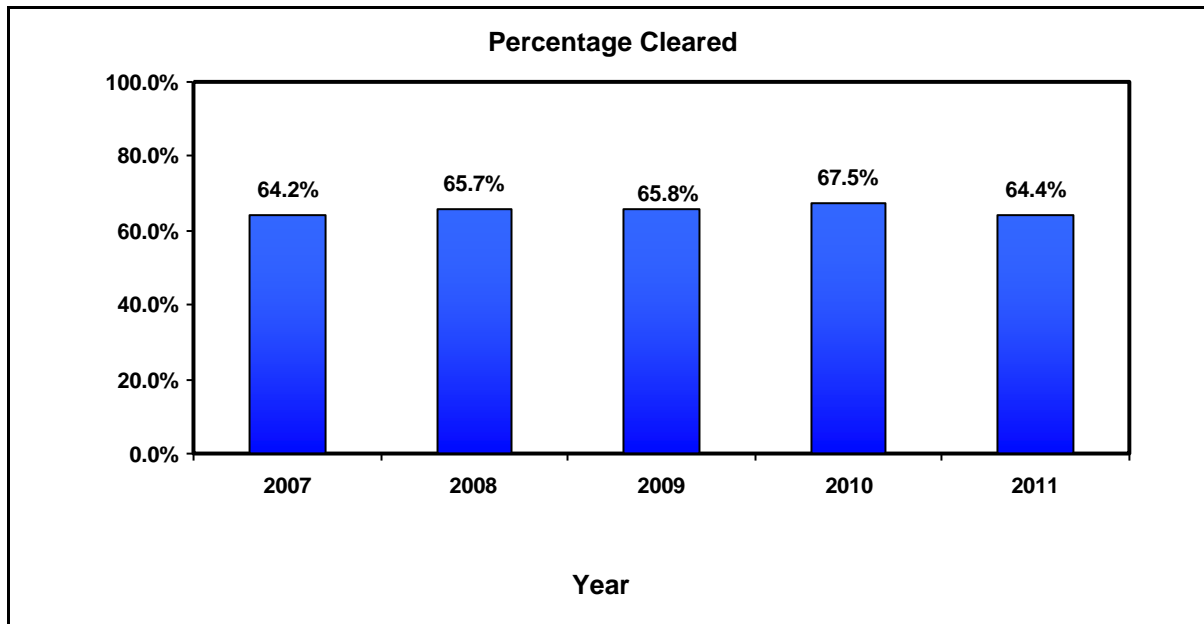
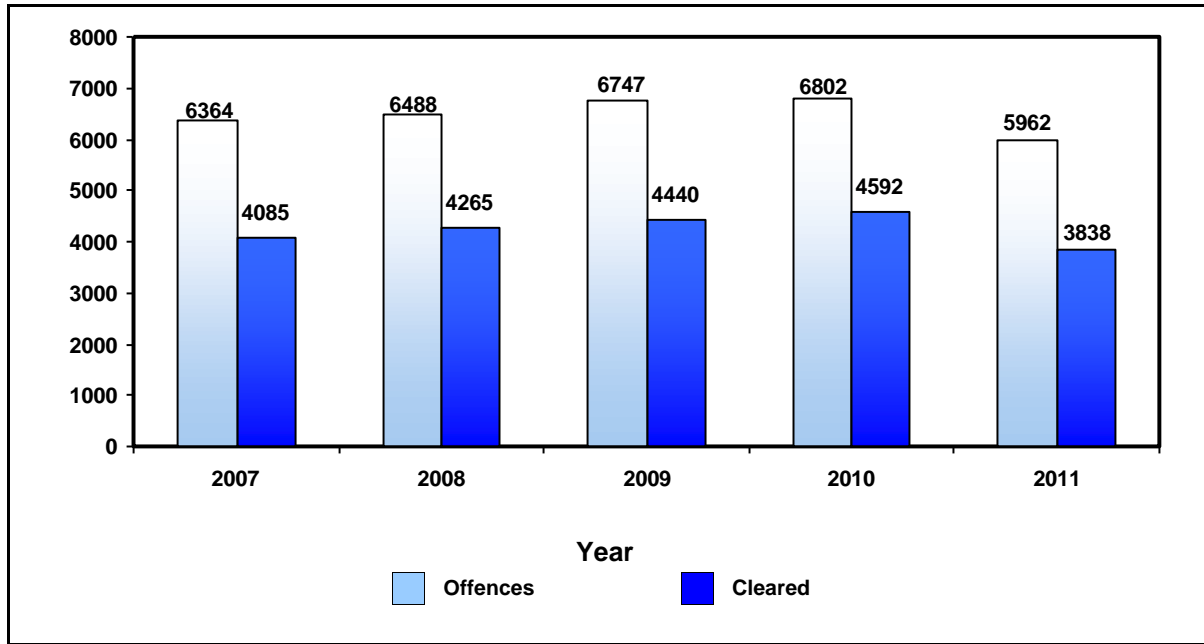

Physical disorder-abandoned auto, fire and property damage.

- 1) All cancelled/unfounded calls are excluded (based on call type and disposition);
  - 2) Call Type: "Police" refers to onview calls; "Public" refers to dispatched, advised, walk-in, call back calls and web reports.
  - 3) Increases in mental health concern events may be related to the implementation of a new initiative.

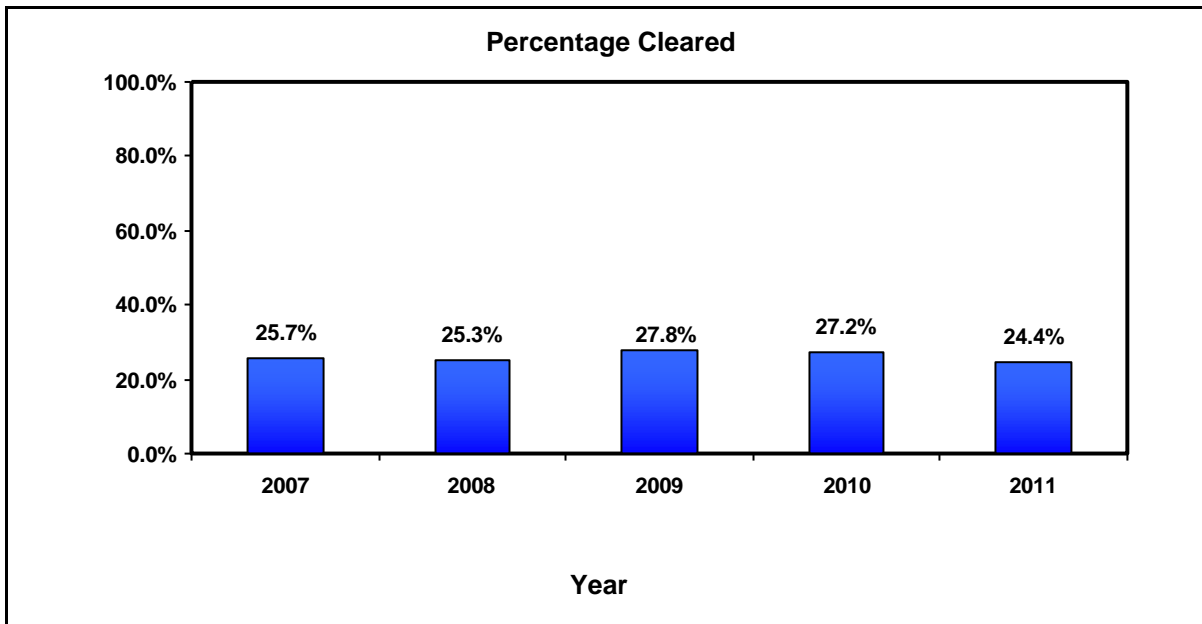
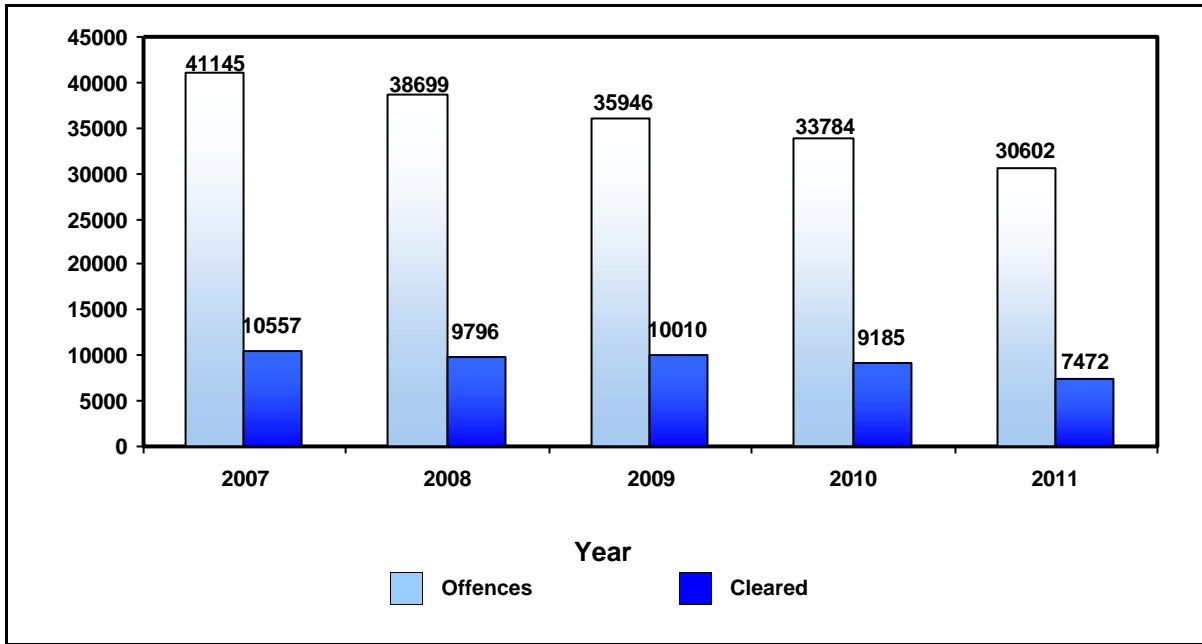
### Number of Offences Year to Date



# Property Crimes - CUMULATIVE NUMBERS

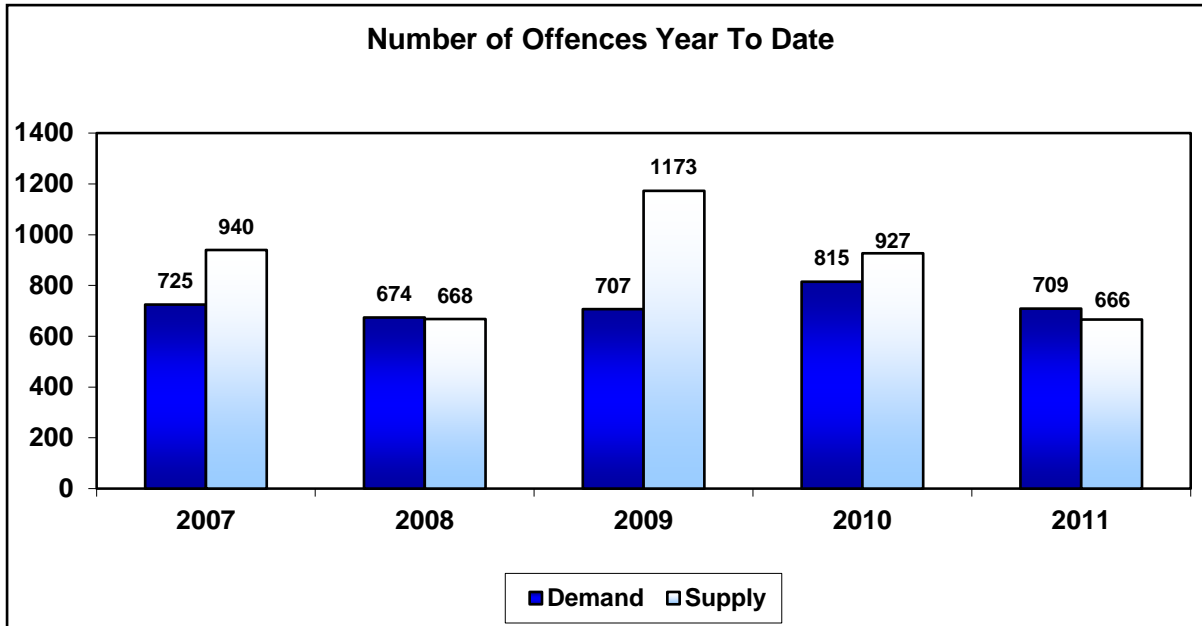

### Number of Offences Year to Date

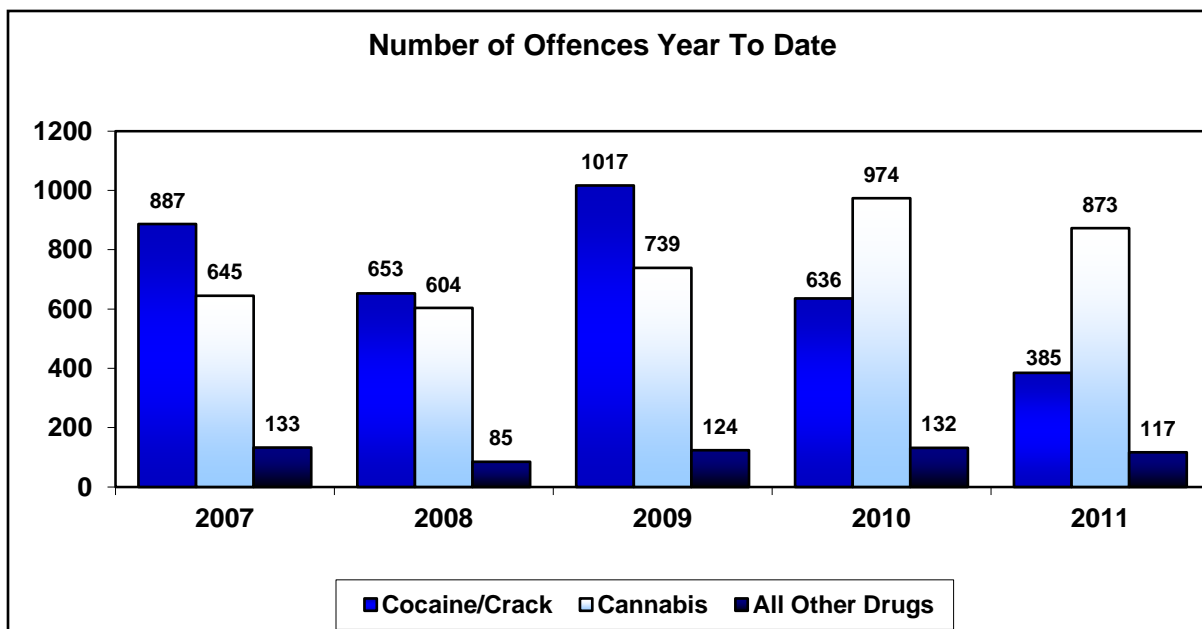


# Drug Offences – CUMULATIVE NUMBERS

When interpreting this data, it is imperative to consider that these figures represent only the number of collisions and they do not account for associated traffic volumes, weather conditions, types of collisions, driver experience, or any other variables which may or may not be significant factors. The locations denoted might be associated with intersections, on/off ramps, or mid-block locations, which are close but not necessarily at the exact specified locations. Collisions occurring on private properties, such as shopping mall parking lots have been excluded from the data in order to strictly assess intersection related collisions.
