

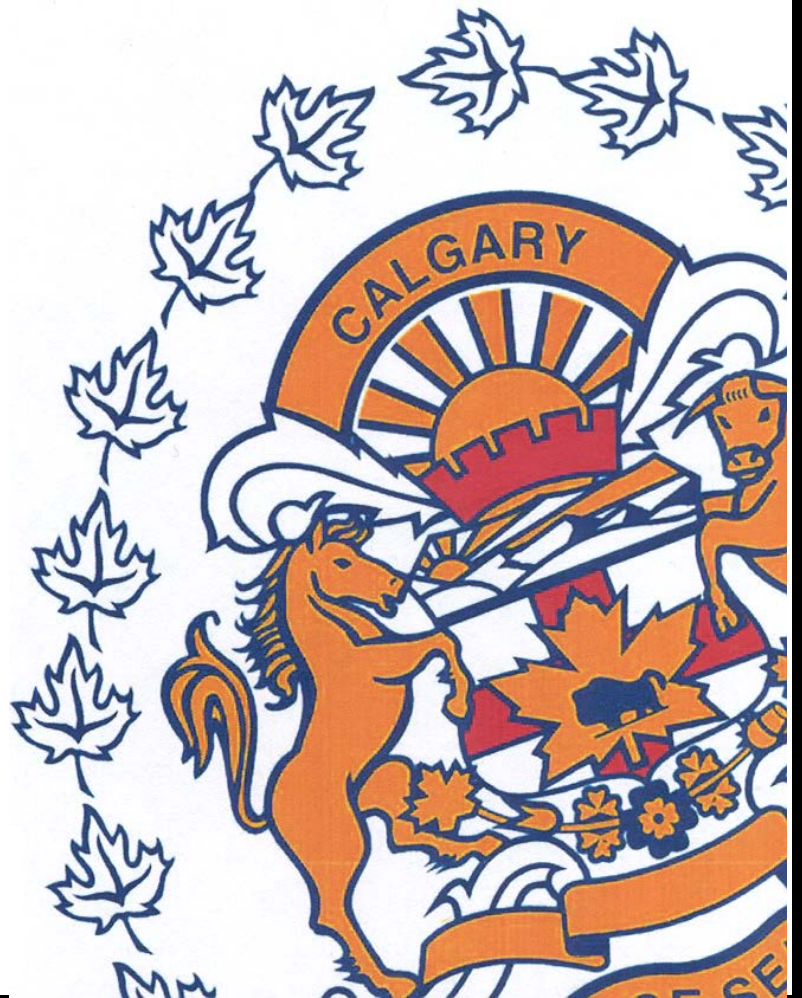

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## REPORT NOTES

Most of the statistical data in this report are derived from the Police Information Management System (PIMS) and compiled by the Centralized Analysis Unit. The numbers reported may change on a daily basis due to the dynamic nature of offences being reported and cleared. Disorder data is derived from the CAD system and is static.

To a large extent, the data in this report are based on accumulated to date information. **(Except for the Monthly Highlights which are based on static information (i.e.: a snap-shot in time).**

- For offences based on accumulated to date information, the number of offences recorded may be higher than previously reported (i.e. in previous statistical reports) due to late reporting. Although this does not greatly affect the number of occurrences for all offences, for some categories it may be as high as a 30-40% increase. The published data for the current period can therefore be expected to increase as time passes. As a result, readers should exercise caution when making comparisons between historical data and current data (i.e. previous year to this year) as data for the historic period will now include late reported offences, but data for the current period will not at this time. To achieve an effective comparison, current data should be evaluated against the originally published data for the historic period.
- Likewise, late reporting affects the number and percentage of offences cleared. Cases are often cleared months and sometimes years later. Consequently, clearances for previous years may appear to be much higher than those of the present year. Cases “cleared by charge” and those “cleared otherwise” are included in these totals.
- For offences based on “static” or “snap-shot” information, data totals will only reflect the number of offences reported in the original publication. They are not updated. Although late reporting may occur, and offences may continue to be cleared as time passes, these new events are not taken into account when preparing this statistical report.

A single incident may result in multiple offences, with each unique *Criminal Code* violation within the incident being counted as an offence. Furthermore, person crime offences are typically counted by the number of victims. Please note that offences are assigned to the month in which the offence “started”, not the month they were reported or cleared. Also note that “attempted” incidents are included in these totals. ## Monthly Highlights – STATIC NUMBER COMPARISON

To reduce the impact of late reporting, comments on this page are a comparison between the CPS February 2014 Statistical Report and the CPS February 2013 Statistical Report. To achieve an effective comparison, current data should be evaluated against the originally published data for the historic period.

### FEBRUARY 2014

#### PERSON CRIME

- ◆ Reported **person crimes** for the month of February 2014 decreased 9.1% when compared to February 2013 (509 offences in February 2014 vs. 560 in February 2013). Additionally, person crimes in February were 9.1% lower than the five year average.
- ◆ Total **robbery** offences for the month of February 2014 decreased 14.5% when compared to February 2013 (59 offences in February 2014 vs. 69 in February 2013).  
In February 2014 there were:
  - 6 **financial robbery** (compared to 1 in February 2013);
  - 11 **commercial robberies** (compared to 20 in February 2013);
  - 38 **person robberies** (compared to 44 in February 2013); and
  - 4 **home invasions** (compared to 4 in February 2013).
- ◆ **Assaults** decreased 10.8% this month (378 offences in February 2014 vs. 424 in February 2013).
- ◆ **Sex offences** decreased 11.1% this month (40 offences in February 2014 compared to 45 in February 2013).

#### PROPERTY CRIME

- ◆ Reported **property crimes** this month decreased 6.6% when compared to February 2013 (2305 offences in February 2014 compared to 2469 in February 2013). Additionally, property crimes recorded 11.5% lower than the five year average for February.
- ◆ **Vehicle theft** (including attempts) increased 13.2% this month when compared to February 2013 (318 offences in February 2014 vs. 281 in February 2013).
- ◆ **Theft** offences decreased 10.5% this month when compared to February 2013 (1103 offences in February 2014 vs. 1233 in February 2013).
- ◆ **Break and enter** offences this month decreased 3.2% when compared to February 2013 (366 offences this month compared to 378 in February 2013).
  - **Residential break and enter** offences this month increased 5.1% when compared to February 2013 (166 offences in February 2014 vs. 158 in February 2013); and
  - **Commercial break and enter** offences decreased 26.2% this month when compared to February 2013 (124 offences in February 2014 vs. 168 in February 2013).
- ◆ **Fraud related** offences increased 2.3% this month (134 offences in February 2014 vs. 131 in February 2013).

#### DISORDER

- ◆ Disorder incidents noted a 2.1% decrease from last February (5355 incidents in February 2014 vs. 5469 in February 2013) and a slight increase against the five year average (~+1.7%, 89 additional incidents).
- ◆ Physical disorder recorded a 4.1% decrease against February 2013 (22 fewer incidents) and an 18.9% decline from the five year average (120 fewer incidents). **Abandoned auto** saw the only notable increase compared to last February (15 additional incidents) as well as noting an increase above the five year average (~12 additional incidents).
- ◆ There were 92 fewer social disorder incidents compared to February 2013 (-1.9%) although a slight increase (+4.5%, 209 additional incidents) was noted against the five year average. **Unwanted guest** was the most noteworthy event type increase against last February (385 additional incidents) as well as noting an increase above the five year average (463 additional incidents); YTD volume was also well above average.

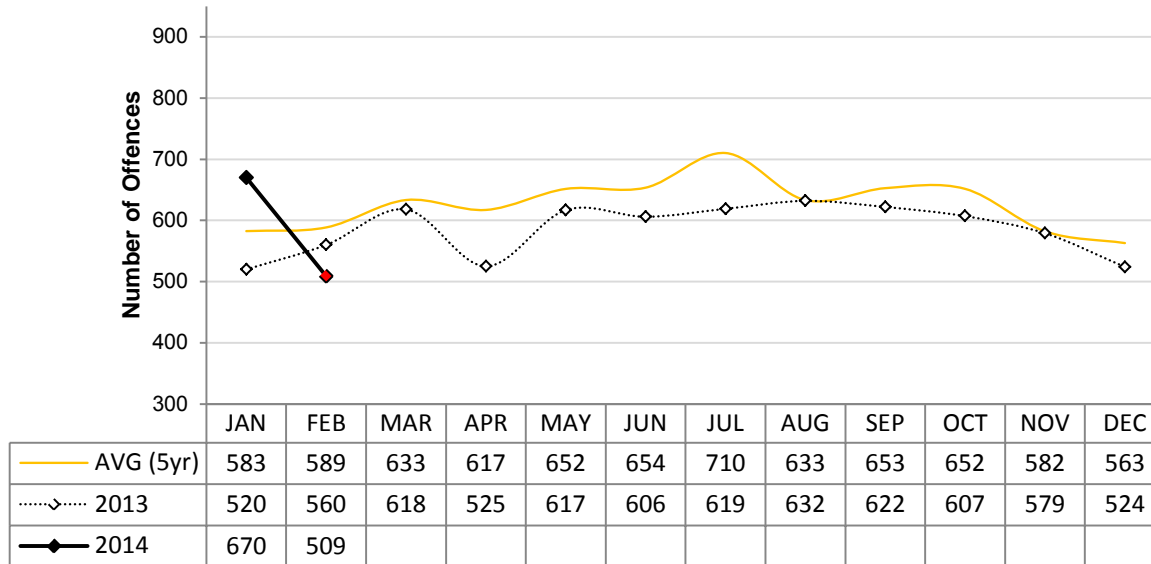
## Calgary Person Crime Statistics – STATIC NUMBERS

Due to manually updating, it's possible 1 or more homicides may be reflected within the assault category. The homicide counts are provided by the homicide unit.

YTD Jan 01 to Feb 28 2014**



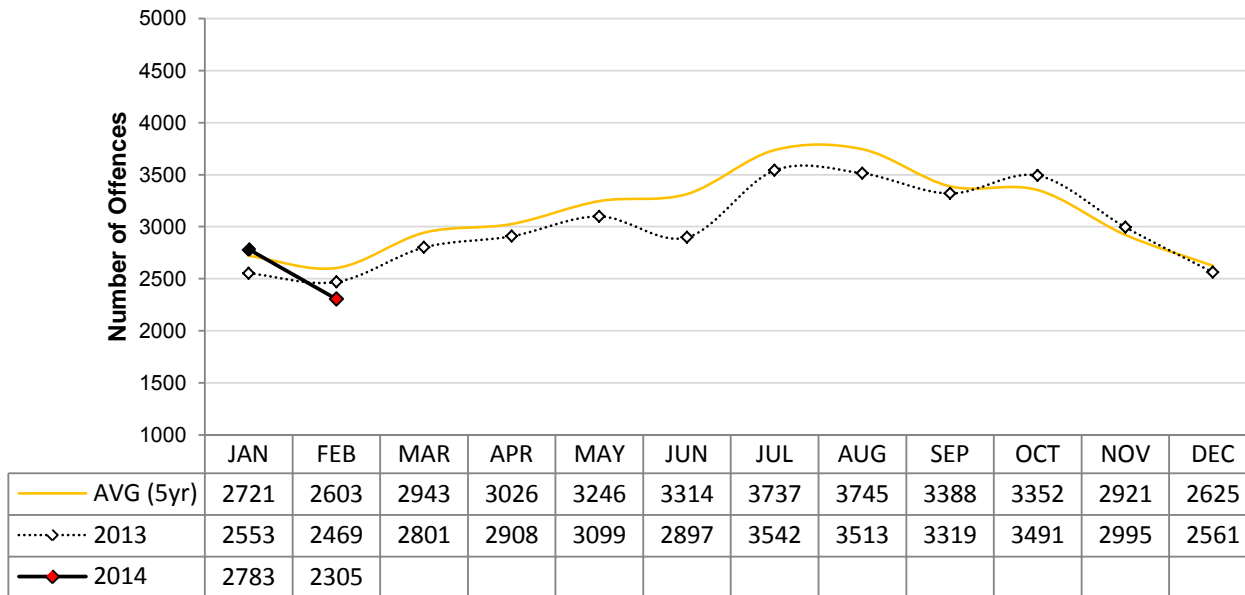

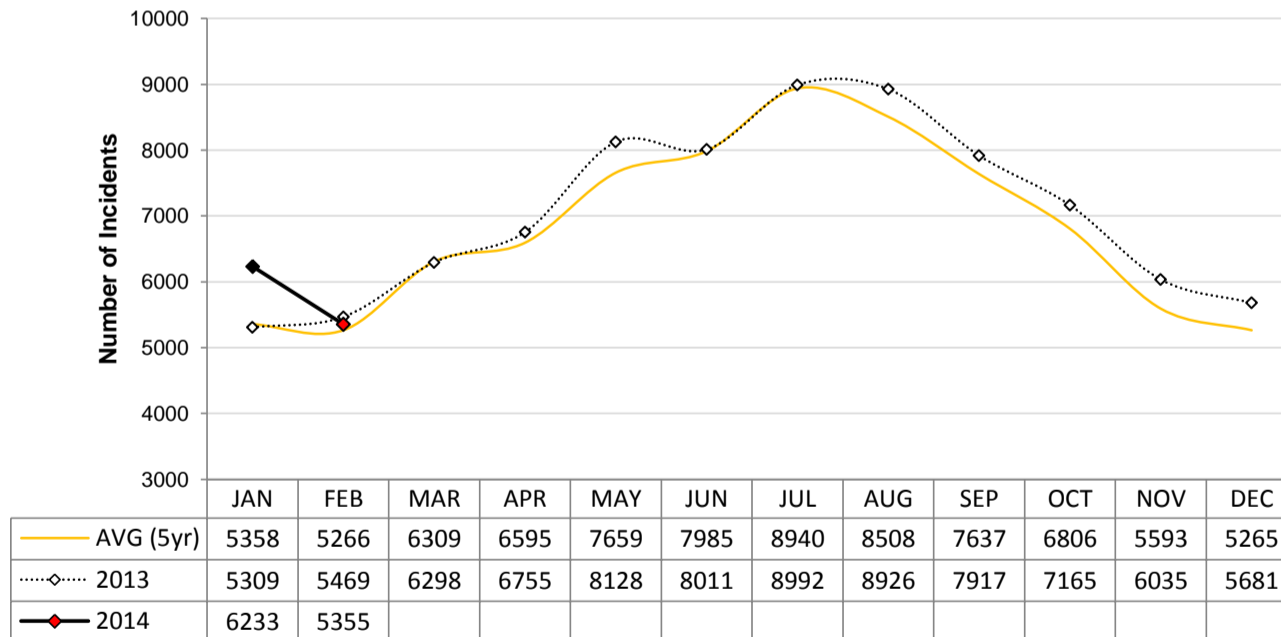
## Calgary Disorder Statistics – CALLS FOR SERVICE

In addition to monitoring crime levels, the Calgary Police Service uses a range of incident types to record levels of "Social & Physical Disorder". The incident types selected for this disorder index are those which can have a negative impact on citizens' quality of life and perception of safety, particularly in public places. These incidents do not tend to be represented well in "traditional" crime statistics which have a propensity to focus more on person and property crime.

\* e-Collision reporting is a data system which became operational in July 2009. At the time this report was published it was not possible to separate all collisions based on level of severity or to determine whether they occurred in a parking lot. Therefore, as e-Collision reports are completed and entered into the CPS records management system, it is determined whether or not they are reportable, and they are removed from the e-Collision count total and reclassified based on level of severity.

When interpreting these data, it is imperative to consider that these figures represent only the number of collisions and they do not account for associated traffic volumes, weather conditions, collision types, driver experience, or any other variables which may or may not be significant factors. The locations denoted might be associated with intersections, on/off ramps, or mid-block locations, which are in close proximity but not necessarily at the exact specified locations. Collisions occurring on private property, such as shopping mall parking lots have been excluded from the data in order to strictly assess intersection related collisions.
