Purpose of the project

Address community concerns regarding:

- poor sidewalks and connections for pedestrians
- poor facilities and connections for cyclists on Home Road
- vehicles making illegal or unsafe left turns into parking lots on 16 Avenue N.W.



Westbound 16 Avenue N.W. just west of Home Road.

Within the study area the proposed design aims to:

- provide safer connectivity for pedestrians, cyclists and motorists
- regulate traffic by preventing illegal or unsafe left turns
- enhance the look of the streetscape

Safety and aesthetic concerns received from the community regarding 16 Avenue N.W. between 46 Street and 49 Street. City staff were directed to review potential upgrades.

City staff met with Montgomery
Community
Association board members to discuss possible upgrades at 16
Avenue and Home Road N.W.

City staff met with Montgomery Community Association board members and members of the Montgomery BRZ to review the preliminary design.

Shared the preliminary design with the community and gathered feedback.

Reviewed the feedback collected and made refinements to the design concept.

Share the final design with the community.

Report back on what we heard about the preliminary design and how feedback was or was not incorporated.

Construction drawings will be created and the project will go to tender.

Construction of this project will be coordinated with the following activities:

- Installation of new traffic signals at 16 Avenue N.W. and Home Road.
- Resurfacing of Home Road north of 16 Avenue N.W.

- pedestrian safety within the study area
- cyclist safety crossing 16 Avenue N.W.
 and Home Road
- traffic volume on Home Road
- turning from eastbound 16 Avenue N.W.
 onto northbound Home Road
- lighting within the study area





What we heard in November


What opportunities have we missed in the study area?

- advanced left turn arrow from eastbound 16 Avenue N.W. onto northbound Home Road
- potential impact of raised median on businesses located along 16 Avenue N.W.
- issues with snow removal and water drainage on the north side of 16 Avenue N.W. that negatively impacts pedestrians



Planned improvements

- Raised median
- New light standards, with decorative banners
- New trees
- Grass planted in the median




Looking southeast across the feature median on 16 Avenue N.W.



Planned improvements

- Sidewalks are improved
- New wheelchair ramps are added
- Larger pedestrian refuge areas

What we heard in November: bike lane


What are the benefits and challenges of the proposed bike lane on Home Road, both in the study area and as a connection to the Bow River Pathway system?

- is a more direct route for cyclists
- making it safer with painted bike lanes would be beneficial
- alternative bike routes in the area are used less but are potentially safer even though not as direct
- need to address safety issues such as signage, pavement conditions, vehicle parking, grade of the road, and bikes sharing the roadway with vehicles
- a bike lane could impact vehicle traffic on Home Road
- loss of on-street parking

Benefits of a bike lane on Home Road



Home Road south of 16 Avenue N.W.



Home Road north of 16 Avenue N.W.

- Improve connectivity to and from the Bow River Pathway system and Bowmont Park for cyclists
- Narrowing a roadway slows motor vehicle speeds
- The Complete Streets Guide states that bike lanes are more appropriate for a collector road that carries over 3,000 vehicles per day
- The 2001 Pathway and Bikeway Implementation Plan includes onstreet bike lanes along Home Road

Advanced left turn arrow

Although it is out of scope for this project, we received comments in November for and against an advanced left turn arrow that would help motorists turn north onto Home Road from eastbound 16 Avenue N.W.

Based on the comments received, the need for this advanced left turn arrow was investigated. The investigation determined that it is warranted but it requires further study. It will not be installed as part of this project.

We will continue monitoring safety at this intersection and a decision regarding the installation of an advanced left turn arrow will be made at a later date.



Next steps

Summer/Fall 2016 – Construction design drawings will be created and a contractor hired to construct the changes in 2017.

Spring/Summer 2017 – A new traffic signal will be installed first, all other construction will be coordinated with the surface overlay of Home Road.
