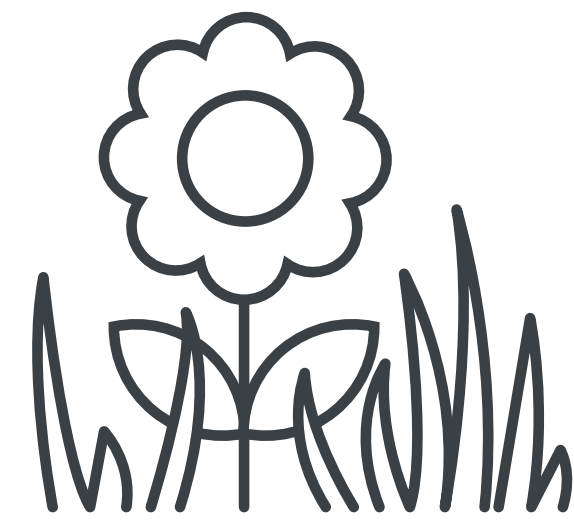
Your input will be used to identify preferences and patterns to help the project team create a space that meets the community's needs.

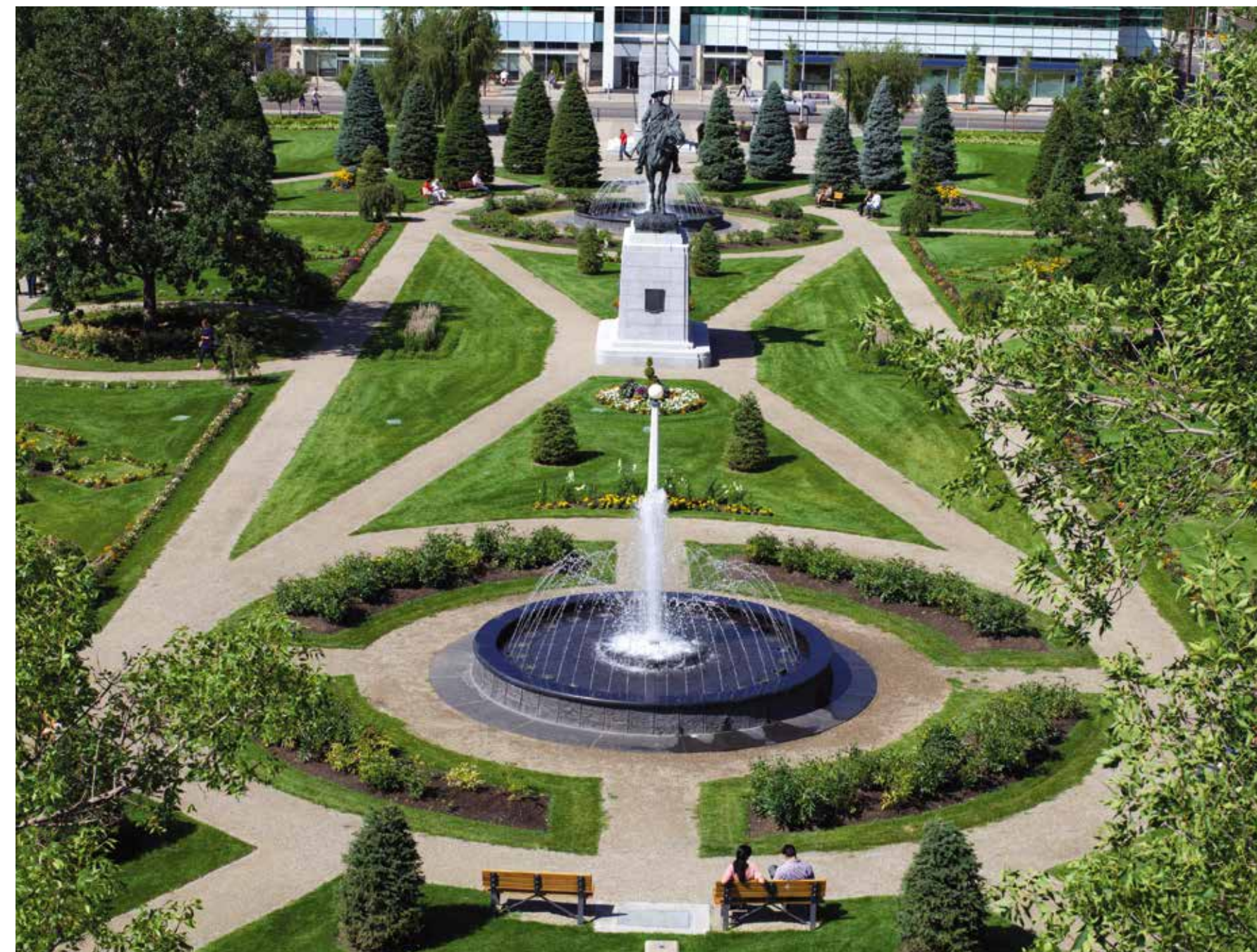
At-Grade Plantings: shrubs, trees, and planting beds that are level with other site surface materials.

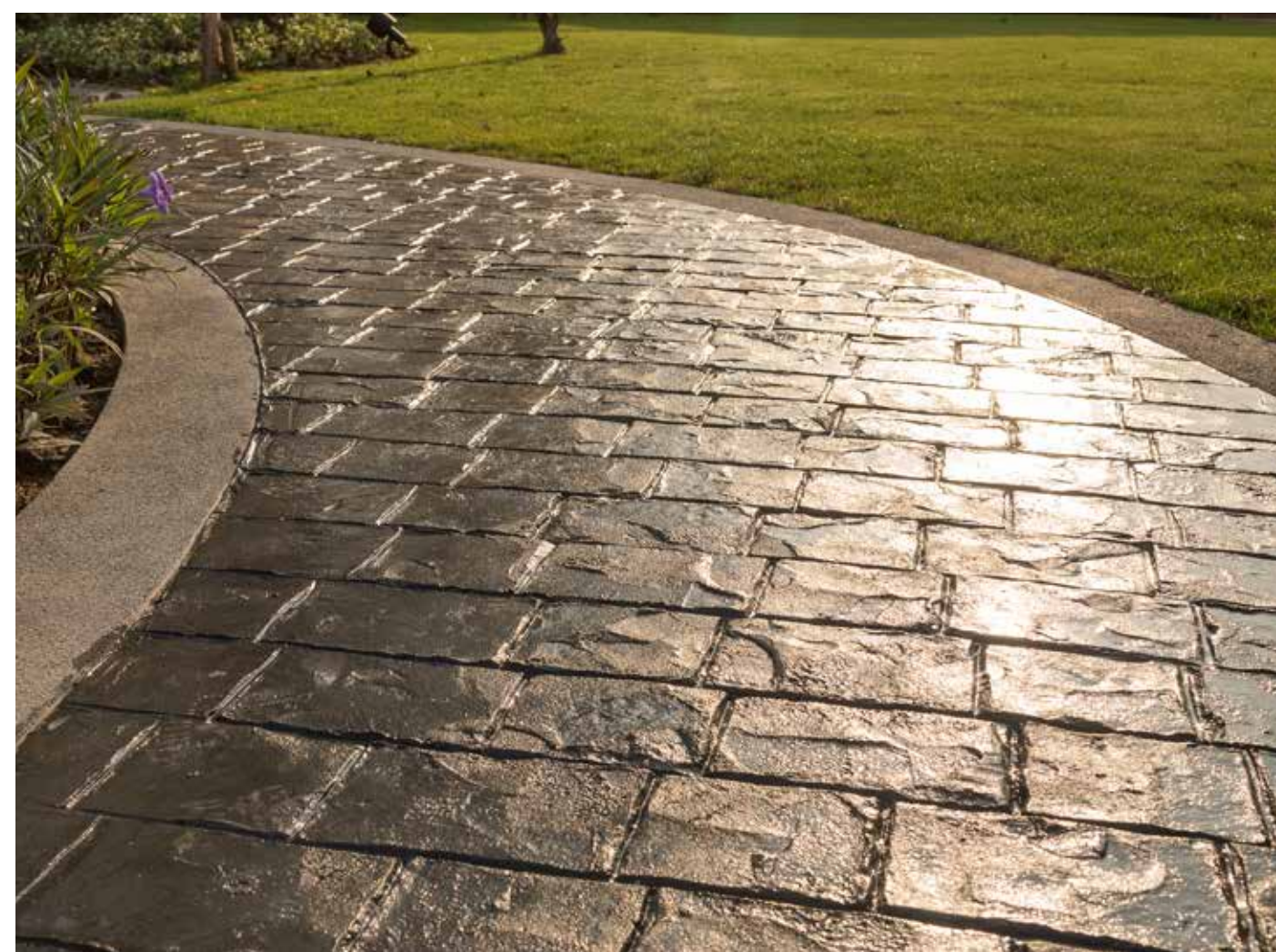
