Stakeholder Report Back: What we Heard

October 5, 2019

Project overview

The scope for this project is to redevelop the Eau Claire Plaza as a community amenity and regional destination in the heart of the city. This plaza redevelopment project builds on the extensive site investigation, public engagement process, and preliminary conceptual designs that have already been completed.

While the redevelopment of the plaza has been a topic of discussion and engagement for several years, there are significant changes within the vicinity that have prompted the present need to redevelop this public space. These include: Bow River flood mitigation measures that include a floodwall and associated riverwalk, along with raising the plaza elevation, redevelopment plans for the Eau Claire Market and adjacent properties, realignment of Riverfront Avenue SW, and the redevelopment of the pedestrian bridges connecting the plaza with Prince's Island.

Engagement overview

The Open House held on October 5th was the second public engagement initiative of this phase of the project and was held in conjunction with an online Engage portal.

Building on the work completed for the Open House in April 2019, a refined design concept was developed in collaboration with The City team, subconsultants, and internal stakeholders.

The intent for this engagement was to report back to the public, summarizing what we heard in the previous Open House and illustrating what we did in response. In addition, we asked the public if the changes/refinements to the design supported the vision and goals for this project.

This report summarizes what we heard at this Open House event and the online Engage portal.

What we asked

In addition to presenting the revised plaza design concept which highlighted the changes since the first Open House, we illustrated how the design achieves the accessibility ambitions for the site. We also showcased the range of programming that the plaza is intended to support and facilitate – events, day-to-day, in all seasons. Finally, we asked the public if the design changes support the vision and goals for the Eau Claire Plaza Public Realm Redevelopment project: strongly agree | somewhat agree | disagree.

Suggestions for consideration include:

- enough bike parking
- take advantage of Eau Claire lumber mill history

Next steps

• End of 2019 – A Design Development package will be submitted to The City's Urban Strategy team and internal stakeholders for review. This package will be finalized in early 2020.








DO THE DESIGN CHANGES SUPPORT THE VISION + GOALS FOR THIS PROJECT?
