

Report Back // What we Heard April 2016

Project overview

The roof of the Parkhill Stanley Park Community Association's south building is structurally unsound. The second floor "Cedar Room" has been closed for safety. There is no funding in place for repairs at this time.

Currently, there is a temporary wall supporting the Cedar Room roof, allowing for continued use of the main floor. The permit for the wall is set to expire on March 31, 2016. Afterwards, the entire south building will be closed to public access, while options for dealing with the structural issue are developed. Part of this process will involve an engineering study.

Engagement overview

The engagement for this project consisted of an online survey that ran from March 8 to 22 and two face to face drop in sessions at the community hall on March 19 and 22.

What we asked

The type of questions found in the survey were related to current community utilization of the facility, personal meaning of the facility to the community residents and the impact of the facility in the community.

What we heard

From the feedback provided by the participants, there is a general consensus from participants that the Parkhill Stanley Park Community Association building is viewed as a community hub. There is also a desire in the community to have the facility repaired properly, potentially with some redevelopment to make it more multi-purpose. A number of comments also centered positively around events and activities both in the building and at the site when discussing what the facility means to both the community in general and participants specifically. However a few respondents felt the site either did not meet their needs or should be redeveloped to include different uses.

Question - What does the Parkhill Stanley Park Community Association facility mean to the community?
