Project overview

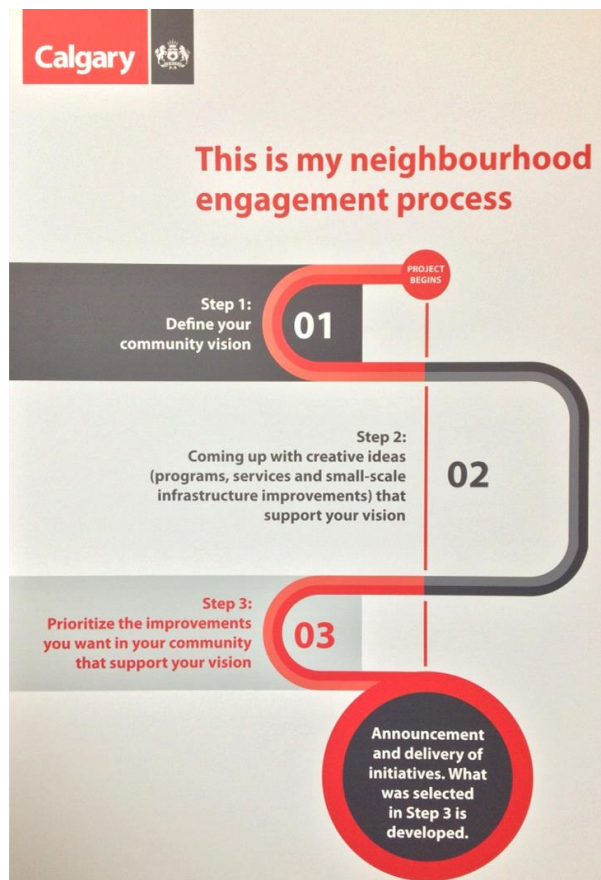
This is my neighbourhood was created to provide an opportunity for residents to partner with The City of Calgary to identify ways to help make their neighbourhood an even better place to live, work and play.

In 2016, The City of Calgary delivered more than 100 programs, services and small-scale improvement projects to a first group of 14 neighbourhoods.

In 2017, The City of Calgary is working with a new group of 14 neighbourhoods. The City will work with the neighbourhoods to first, identify a neighbourhood vision. From that vision, participants working with City staff, will come up creative ideas (programs, services and small-scale infrastructure improvements) that support their neighbourhood vision as identified in the engagement. In 2018 those programs, services and infrastructure projects will be implemented.

Engagement overview

This report back covers what we heard during the visioning for Falconridge/Castleridge. This is the first step in the engagement for the this is my neighbourhood program.



What we asked

Residents in Falconridge/Castleridge were asked:

What would make Falconridge/Castleridge a better place to live, work and play? They were then asked to choose their top three vision words from a list, (see below), or to add their own and explain why they chose that word.

How we connected

There were three different ways that citizens could provide feedback:

1. Everyone in the neighbourhood was mailed a postcard with vision question and could drop it off at the Falconridge/ Castleridge Community Association. The postcards were sent to 3,429 residents.
2. The vision survey was available online through the engage.calgary.ca/myNeighbourhood/falconridgecastleridge portal page from April 7, 2017 until July 7, 2017. The survey was promoted on neighbourhood bold signs, through Facebook, Tim Horton's TV, and recreation facilities as well as on the Falconridge/ Castleridge Community association websites and in their monthly newsletters. We received 346 ideas in Falconridge/Castleridge through online engagement.
3. City staff attended various community events to gather feedback. The table below summarizes the events we attended, and how many people attended each event. Through these events we received 196 completed postcards.

What we heard

Residents of Falconridge/ Castleridge were very excited to participate in helping to determine a vision for their neighbourhood. The most frequently selected vision words were safe, clean and beautiful. When looking at “why” these themes were identified, the following sentiments were heard:

Safe - Participants in Falconridge/Castleridge value a neighbourhood where they are safe from illegal criminal activities. They desire a community where they feel comfortable being out in the neighbourhood without risk of encountering a crime. Suggestions were made for increased police presence, more community involvement/ neighbourhood watch programs, improved sidewalk and lighting conditions and some traffic calming measures.

Clean - Having a clean community is important to Falconridge/ Castleridge residents. Residents would like to see the amount of garbage and junk disposed of in back alleys decreased and feel there is too much litter around the community. Suggestions were made for more community clean-up programs and more garbage disposal services and infrastructure.

Beautiful – Having a beautiful community is important to Falconridge/ Castleridge residents. They feel community pride can be fostered by:

- Ensuring regular lawn maintenance and removing weeds;
- Repairing community fencing and installing a new community sign;
- Regular maintenance and revitalization of green spaces with more trees and flowers.

It should be noted that there were a significant number of “other” vision words provided by residents, however in analyzing the “why”, the comments and values were consistent with what was shared for safe, clean and beautiful and reiterated the importance of these to the community.

Verbatim Comments

The following is all of the verbatim comments we received for Falconridge/Castleridge. The verbatim is broken down by Vision Word and includes the submissions received online and those received in person through the postcards. If personal information was submitted the following is used where that information was removed: [personally identifying information removed].

Vision Word: SAFE

Selected – 198 times.

Answers to “why” below

- With the crime rate in the area, we need more law enforcement in the area
- Need more road and parking controls in place, especially around schools and playgrounds. To make it safer to just cross the roads on a regular day. To go for walks in the day or evenings.
- A community is not a community if it is not safe enough.
- Make walkways well lit. Have pedestrian crossing lights at entrance to Prairie Winds park. Many drivers speed on Castleridge Blvd and it is not safe for pedestrians going from Castleridge to Prairie Winds Park. Keep police patrols active on bikes and foot. Especially around the c-train station/superstore as we get some wierd people around that area asking for money and following us.
- The new streetlights are very faint, I do not feel safe at night to take a walk. I have a teenage daughter and with the type of people who rent here, I worry when she walks alone.
- When I moved into the Castleridge neighbourhood 20 years ago, I maybe heard a police siren once a month. Now, police sirens go off every single night! Recent shootings just one block away. Abandoned stolen vehicles have shown up on my block at least 3 times in the last year? I have become hesitant to answer my door bell after dark. Not a feeling I wish to have.
- Increased peace of mind, lower insurance rates, higher property value.
- "Sidewalks are unsafe to walk on in & around Castleridge.
- The roads are falling apart & need major work.
- Alleyways. Hard to navigate, especially on Garbage Days, when bins are all over the place. There is no maintenance done in back alleys.
- Drivers speeding in back alleys.
- Work vehicles that are brought into the neighbourhood, parked in front or out in the alleys of residents, that are hard to see past.
- Five or more vehicles to one single family home.
- Watching City Buses & other vehicles, push their way from a right turning lane, to cut off through traffic, or traffic turning left to get ahead of the line up on Westwinds Dr, Castleridge Blvd & Castleridge Drive."
- not safe, very transient, illegal secondary suites
- There is not enough lighting on my street, where I live, there is only 4 lights, 3 on 1 side and 1 on the other side, when it gets dark, because of the gap between them, it does not make for a safe walk down my street.
- So you can feel safe in your community
- Roads are in poor repair and not always safe to drive on.
- Concern with driver knowledge and speeds
- I would like to meet friendly people in my neighbourhood

- Shooting nearby so even being in the house is not always safe. Need more police in area
- "Because if you don't feel safe, you don't feel happy in your community. If there aren't safety measures in place, we can get hurt.
- Suggestions to make our community safer:
- Getting to know people in our community. We would like the opportunity to participate in community picnics and meet and greets with the people that live around us."
- Have two pre-teen daughters and I am nervous about letting them walk around in case someone approaches them. Also people speed through the school zones. Need more police presence.
- People speeding in the playgrounds zone...(Falmere way)
- Streets are very dark. Lots of police presence.
- Very scary here...gun shots
- We need more patrols, especially along 68th street where street racing happens at all times of day.
- Too many shootings and other crime police need to have better time on when you call about crime and show up also cracked down on these rental houses
- People who live here are nice
- More police presence
- Car got stolen.
- Too many major crimes happen in or close to my neighbourhood. Its scary.
- There is a lot of bullying in the schools. Also drug dealing in schools and kids using drugs
- Glad to see more police patrolling our streets. Makes us feel protected.
- So many times people rip through the school zones, consistently see hawks flying/circling overhead with no notifications as to why
- When something breaks in Mission, it's fixed quickly. When something breaks in Falconridge, not so much. We've had fencing (city fencing)

down for over a year, barriers broken, graffiti, etc. It's not attractive nor does it make citizens feel safe.

- Would like to see less rental houses as they are often poorly managed and become eyesores in the community as well as attracting some tenants who are often desirable
- I want to be able to go out and feel safe. I want my child to feel safe.
- Stray cats and unattended dogs wander around
- All night long you can hear racing cars go up and down Westwinds Boulevard. And no one stops to let pedestrians cross the sidewalks. You can make eye contact with drivers and they will ignore you. This occurs at both the crosswalks that join to Prairie Winds Park. And the crosswalks are not well marked.
- Add lights and proper pathways to such parks to make them safer and more enjoyable.
- Something has to be done with the skunk problem on my street and possibly other streets in Castleridge for sure. I know some neighbours might find them cute and offer them food, but as a homeowner and a pet owner they are a nuisance, and often VERY stinky.
- The number of break ins seems to be out of control
- "More police presence if that is possible would be appreciated as recent events have eroded citizen's confidence in safety and well being."
- It would be nice to not experience bullying and vandalism.
- Eliminate weapons, gangs, drugs, crime on the streets
- Children in schools are often bullied and there can be violence towards them.
- Cars drive too fast and there are a lot of kids in the neighbourhood. More playground zones needed.

- The fence on castleridge Blvd should be strong to keep strangers from using our backyard as a shortcut to walk from the plazas into castleridge. I don't feel my children can play safely in their backyard.
- Should be able to walk home from school. Criminal activity is high.
- Families need to feel safe in their communities and homes in order to live fully
- Roads get flooded in the condo complex - Falshire Lanes
- "Vehicle break in's"
- Drivers are not safe at night (over speeding)"
- Too much bullying of children in the schools. Kids fighting
- we all have to keep eyes, ears and tell someone when something is wrong.. The police can't do it all alone.
- During the school year every lunch hour and after school we have the high school kids from Bishop McNally driving NASCAR down our front street. There are many children who live on this street and a playground with posted speed signs. Police patrol during these times would be wonderful or worse case scenario having calming devices installed.
- If we have more people active in the neighbourhood we will be safe
- Crime - drugs, break and enters have increased
- Knowing my neighbours helps me feel very safe in. My community.
- I do not feel safe at night in my area. There are drug deals going down on our street and in the church parking lot across from me. The church finds used condoms often. It needs to be better patrolled.
- Stronger police presence
- Every member of our community deserves to feel safe.

- I hesitate to walk anywhere, at any time. Even parking lots seem unsafe after dark. Higher police presence, but in an interactive and friendly way, would make me feel more secure. Only see or interact with police in the community when they are responding to crime, often of a violent nature.
- I don't trust my 6 year old son to walk around the block. I see the ne as very unsafe. Right across the street a few years back a car was on fire at 2 in the morning. Started at the back window or trunk. The owner said there was no reason there wasn't anything in there. Also... my car broken into 2 times as well as my shed twice too. Vandalism in the alleys. Doesn't feel safe
- some violent incidents and break ins happened in our community. we will like to see more Police patrolling in the area and better street lighting to make safe community.
- The speed limit on 52nd should be slower than 60. Maybe then people would have time to stop for the red lights.
- Lots of poverty in the area. Gangs are an issue and there are also homeless people in the area. The Hawks helicopter is circling the neighborhood everyday. I've lived in the same house for 14 years and I've seen swat teams, K9 unit running through my yard, a burning vehicle, serial rapist, serial arsonists etc. It's not a nice neighborhood and unfortunately we can't afford to buy anywhere else, so we have to make the best of raising our daughter here. I would not feel safe walking at night.
- Not safe after supper, not sure any community is! Certainly wouldn't be going for any walks anywhere.
- Traffic enforcement at schools so kids are safe to be dropped off.
- Community engagement
- Too many accidents. Crosswalks not safe for CHILDREN.

- Some cars speed.
- Because it's such a run down area, it feels unsafe. Some of the older homes look like they are falling apart, the schools need better parks, better lighting as well.
- When people know each other it feels safer
- Cars speed in playground zones.
- More police presence to decrease fights and increase awareness
- Calgary is a relatively safe place but getting less safe. Random shootings.
- Take care of each other and watch out for each other.
- People ride their bikes on sidewalks and it's dangerous
- I live in Falconridge and the community itself just has a "ghetto" feel to it. I've witnessed multiple drug deals etc down the street or in alleys in broad daylight while out for a walk or drive with my kid. Definitely don't feel safe going out at night even if it was for an emergency.
- Numerous attacks on citizens. Suggest better police presence and better lighting in alleys
- I believe that rental property owners need to be more respectful of the community by taking care of their properties and thus ensuring a more safe environment
- Lots of people around.
- People are confident to walk around and talk to people. I am a landlord so I want my tenants to feel safe.
- Repair the road on Castlefall Grove and the road leading to the school which was only partially fixed
- A car was stolen outside my house. Also my teens tell me that drugs at their school (Terry Fox Jr. High) is a problem

- I had a fire in my townhouse and there have been several fires in my Calgary Housing complex on Falconridge Blvd. People need more fire prevention information
- Potholes in road along Castlefall Grove
- Some crimes being reported in the area.
- The pavement on Castlefall Grove needs repair BADLY
- "This is a big deal..... not sure, cause this is a different world, then when I grew up. If I had kids, which I don't..... I would not let them leave the house. I would also home school. To much anger, there is no right or wrong..... just do what ever you want..... people need structure, need rules.... we need to have right and wrong. We need to have accountability. So that being said, it is very important to feel safe and secure..... I think we need, morals, values and principles. All I can come up with more Police, more security, more volunteers, more cameras and more smiles..... bringing all cultures together for seminar how to be kind and show respect and love one another..... I think most people have forgotten how to love, how to show kindness and how to respect..... maybe do a pay it forward movement to spread thru out the city..... leaving a note in your neighbor mailbox of what good deed they did for them asking them to pay it forward to another neighbor....."

Sidewalks are dangerous in spring due to insufficient water drainage from the side walk. It gets slippery or very messy to walk along.
- Our Boulevards need sprucing up - grass, trees, shrubs, etc and there are too many commercial signs everywhere which should not be permitted
- Because the entire city has the impression that our neighbourhood is a dump & ugly. Family and friends hate coming to the NE - they don't feel safe & they feel it's uncared for. The city doesn't give it the same attn as other areas of Calgary. By

the way the "Castleridge Estates" sign fell apart years ago and now there is nothing. It would be nice to have that back. It was on the corner of Falconridge and Westwinds Blvd. There are also too many private individuals parking their commercial hauling trailers in residential areas and they sit for weeks and never move.

- Abandoned Furniture, Mattresses, Tires and Household Goods devalues and ruins the neighborhood.
- I have lived in Falconridge 28 years. Right now, the alley behind my cul-de-sac has a toilet, a computer monitor and a car tire scattered behind people's fences. They are not behind my property line or I would have cleaned them up. And this is just no my laneway. Where ever I walk my dog there are old couches and other large pieces household garbage. I would like better response time from by-laws to get this garbage cleaned up. Or a process whereby if I take it to the dump, the fee for disposal is waived.
- There is so much garbage along the boulevards due to the fast food chains and Jr. and Senior high schools. They should be held accountable for cleaning up the neighborhood. The alleys are also often full of discarded furniture or large items that the garbage truck won't pick up. Maybe more than one community cleanup per year is needed. Or fines for excessive debris. I also often see shopping carts around and I will call the store they belong to for pickup (but they are not always quick to respond). The low income housing complexes are also full of garbage, the complex manager needs to address this (the complex mentioned is directly across from Falconridge Elementary.) There is a pathway that is full of garbage and someone has layed down broken sidewalk pieces.
- Castleridge is in a much needed sprucing up. Boulevards are littered and packed with numerous signs and garbage. People put up signs everywhere and they are a distraction to drivers as well as an eye sore. The City of Calgary needs to ensure that the signs that are not allowed are taken down!
- The neighbourhood has a bad reputation and needs to be cleaned up. Cleaning up people's yards is a first step towards a clean neighbourhood. Clean yards mean pride of ownership. Clean yards are also safer.

- Educate neighbors on the importance of cleaning up after your pets. I suggest mailing a notice to all dog owner in Castleridge or place a sign on mail boxes.

This not only makes our area feel crowded and dirty, but very unattractive. Paper signs for advertising PRIVATE businesses also are a part of this problem. There should be some sort of law allowing a reasonable distance between repeat signs. Everywhere we look, there are signs on intersections, parking lots, and sidewalks.

- Smaller parks in the neighbourhood are run down and old. The park on my street is dark and not fun for kids. Castlebrook Way. I'm sure there are others.
 - "I live on 1163 Falworth road and there have been many incidents in past few years when things were stolen from cars in my street, including mine.. and some of my neighbors cars got broken glasses. Some one shot down my back door with air gun. and then some one stole my 100 ft long power cable that i use to plug in my car.. Some one also tried to steal my garbage bins in our back alley, we stopped him to take away the second one as my mom and wife ran after him. some shootings were also in news around same time in falconridge. All these events makes me a bit uncomfortable and feel insecure in the community.. Hence I advice installation on CCTV cameras in sensitive areas, and more rounds of police. plus a seminar where the members in my community are invited for a seminar targeting awareness of security in our community.. and how we as neighbors help each other.. some incentive should be offered in installation of out door cameras in home facing street and back alleys.. that will help police to crack down people responsible for the theft and damage.
 - These are my Ideas. I am not an expert that is why a meeting/discussion/ seminar with an expert would be great."
- "With the exception of Prairie Winds, the parks all need to be updated and enlarged. We have many great spaces for the parks but the existing structures are small, old and (in the words of my 8 year old) boring to play on.
- When I am in other parts of the city (MacKenzie Lake, Hidden Valley) the parks are beautiful, full of super fun structures and have the blacktop instead of rocks.
- My kids don't even ask to go to the parks near home anymore, and are tired of always going to the same one (Prairie Winds -although we are looking forward to the construction being done to enjoy the water features)"

- Fences on Falconridge Blvd are falling down - no maintenance/upkeep done.
- Front driveways, that are not professionally done.
